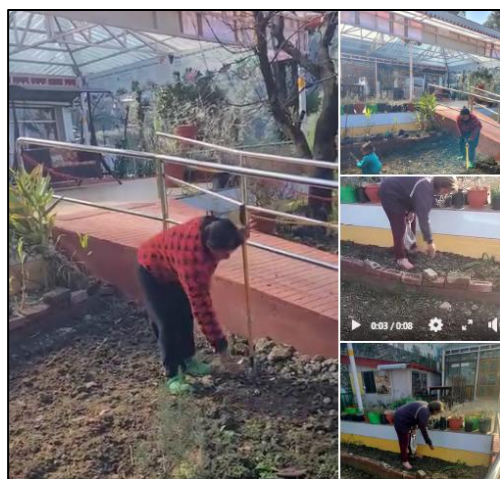


HimSurabhi: Aroma Living Museum Report 2025

1. On 30th January 2025, a warm and pleasant day marked the beginning of the German chamomile sowing at Mussoorie Fragrance and Flavours Institute. With deep-rooted commitment to hands-on learning and sustainable practice, the seeds were lovingly sown by Dr. Jyoti Marwah, Yachana, and their youngest budding naturalist, little Arav “Tiny” Bhole. A symbolic start to the growing season, it was a moment that blended tradition, mentorship, and a heartfelt connection to Nature.



2. On 10th February 2025, the Kisan Mela at CIMAP Pantnagar proved to be an enriching and memorable experience for Mussoorie Fragrance and Flavours Institute. The team was honored by the recognition of their work in the keynote address by Dr. Om Prakash Singh, Vice Chancellor of Uttarakhand Open University. A proud highlight was the launch of *SHIVSA*, our natural perfume uniting blooms of the Himalayan Shivaliks and Konkan Sahyadri, officiated by Dr. Sahney. The event also marked the beginning of *Himsurabhi Aroma Business*—a collaborative venture with young medical professionals passionate about Konkan aromas. With several invitations extended from Kolhapur, Himsurabhi is now preparing to take this fragrance journey further.



8. 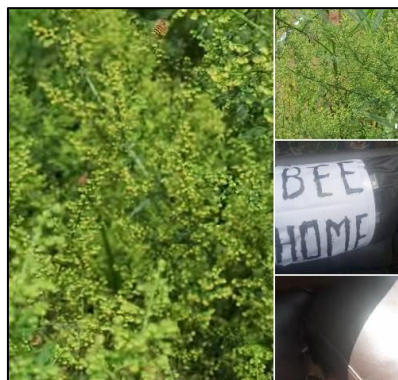
natural, plant-based alternatives to protect health and the environment. It's a must-read that urges reflection on our everyday lifestyle choices.

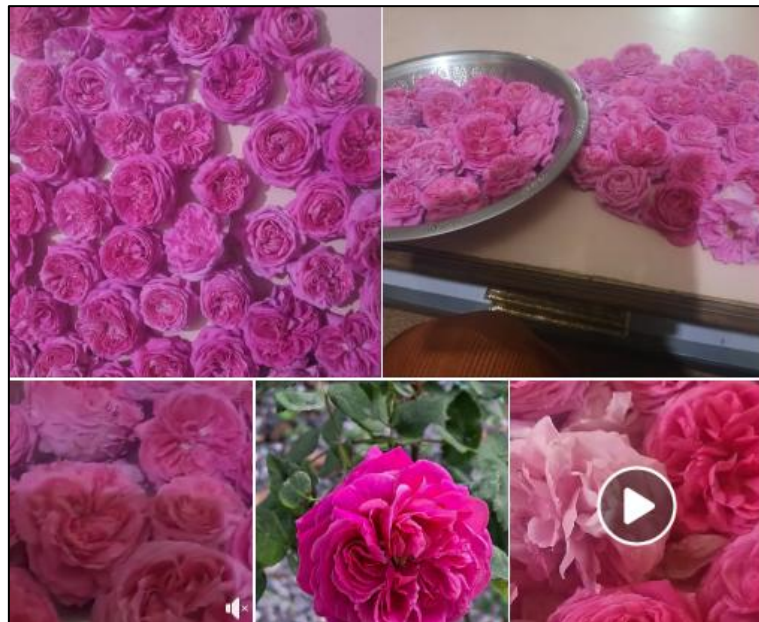

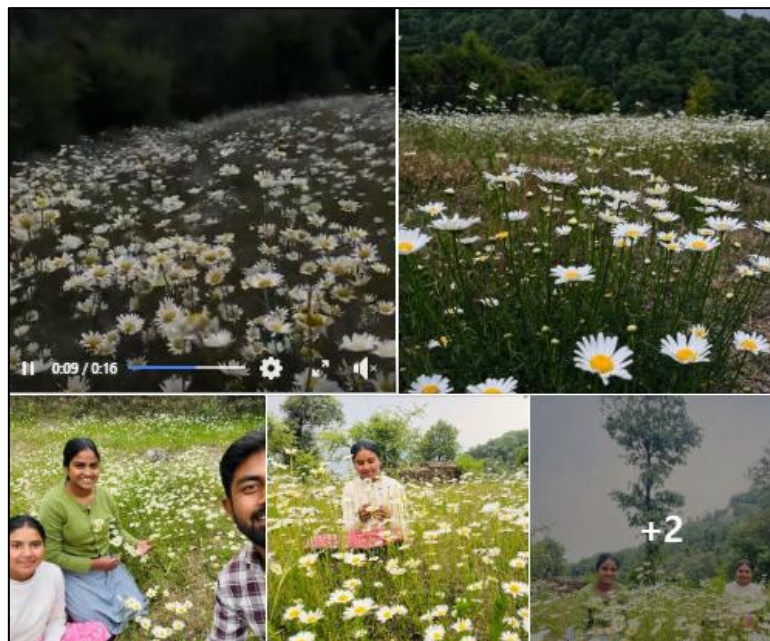

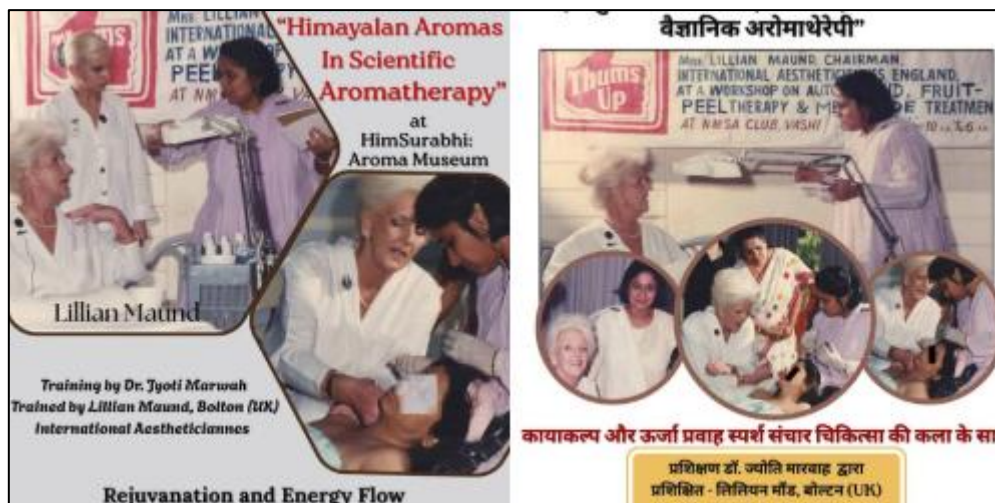
(*Him Champa*) for natural perfumery. A heartfelt tribute to his dream, now blossoming into reality.

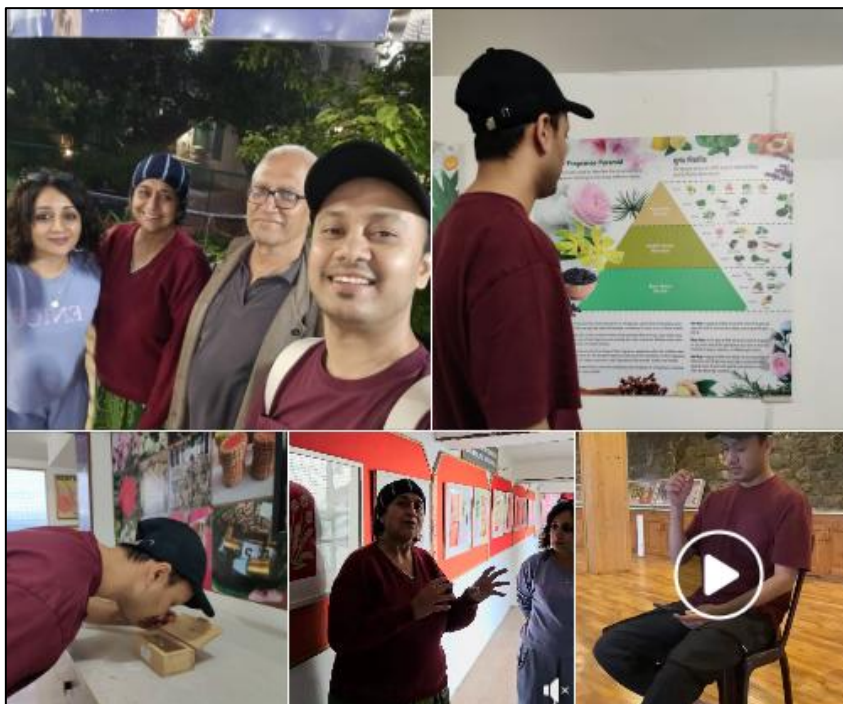

40. On 1st September 2025, Mussoorie Fragrance and Flavours Institute introduced a Timru-based oil-pulling formulation for healthy gums and strong teeth. Drawing on in-house distilled essential oils and natural perfumery expertise, the blend pairs Timru (*Zanthoxylum armatum*) essential oil with cold-pressed carrier oil specifically sesame and coconut oil. The formulation aims to freshen breath, support oral hygiene, and encourage gentle lymphatic drainage from the oral cavity. Users are guided to choose the carrier oil that best suits them and to practice simple, self-applied routines that align with natural wellness principles.



41. On 29th September 2025, at the National Botanical Research Institute (NBRI), Lucknow, Mussoorie Fragrance and Flavours Institute gained insightful exposure by learning the technology for dehydrated flower encapsulation. The hands-on experience provided a deep understanding of preserving the natural beauty, fragrance, and essence of flowers through scientific innovation. It was a wonderful entrepreneurial exposure, opening new avenues for sustainable product development, creativity, and the fusion of science with natural aesthetics.

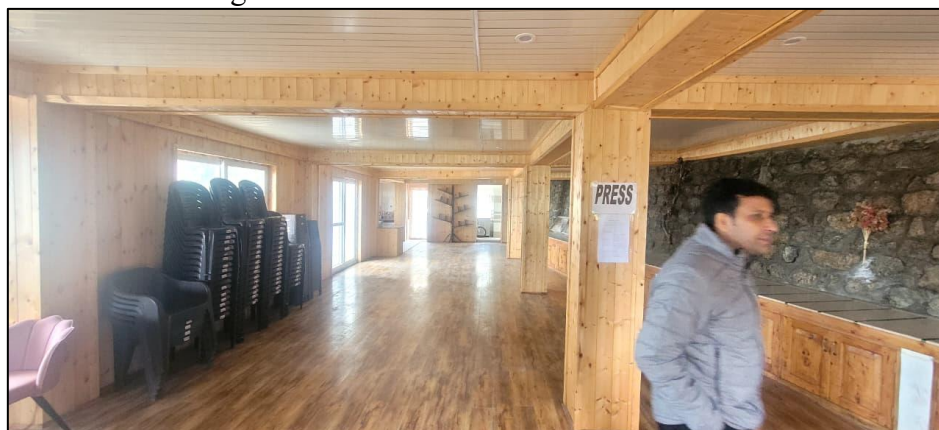

The product utilizes walnut pericarp, known for its antibacterial activity due to juglone, and reflects an initiative toward sustainable, plant-based value addition. Positive feedback is anticipated.



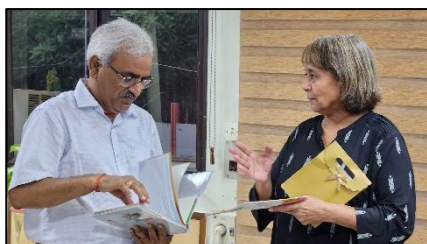

Today marked the collection of this natural “manna,” highlighting the richness of forest-based resources and the need for greater awareness of their nutritional and wellness potential.

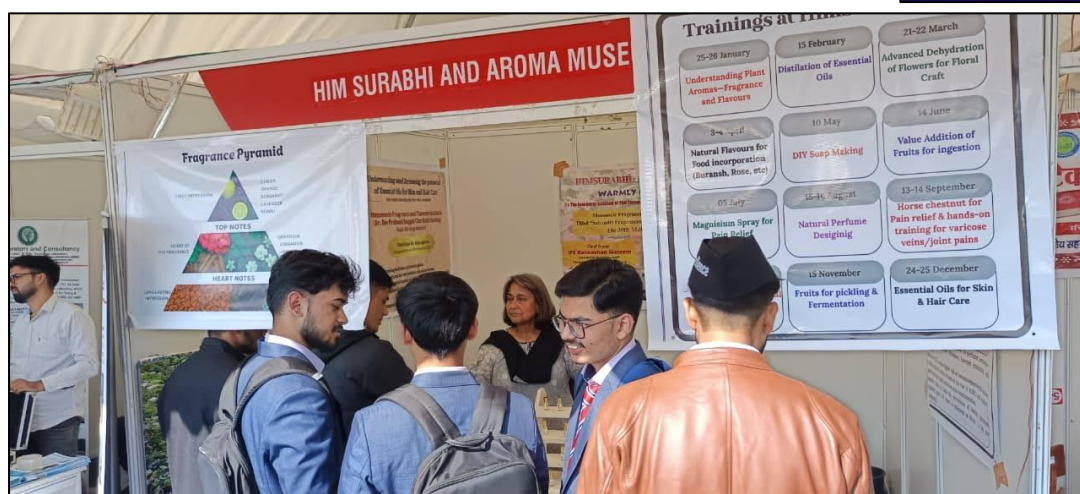

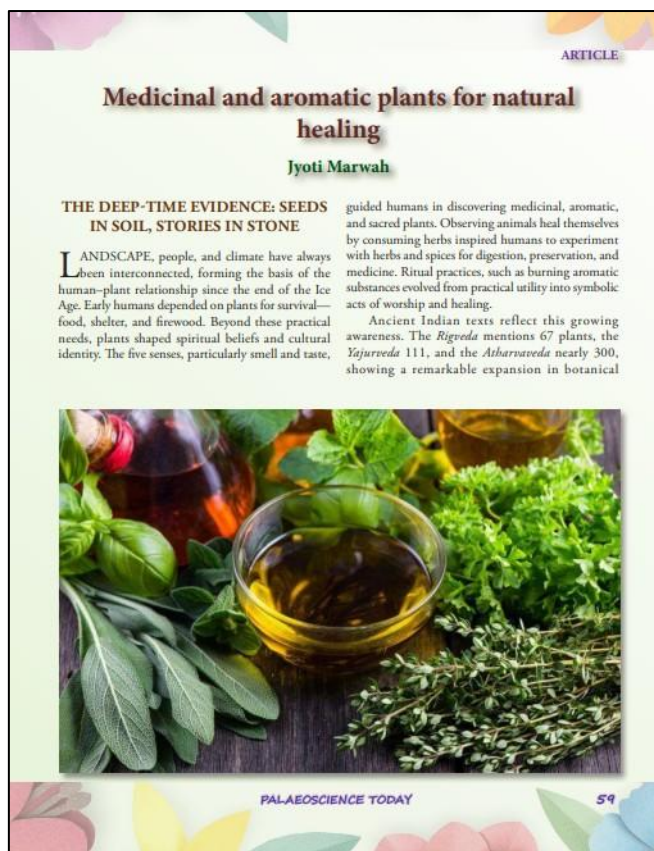

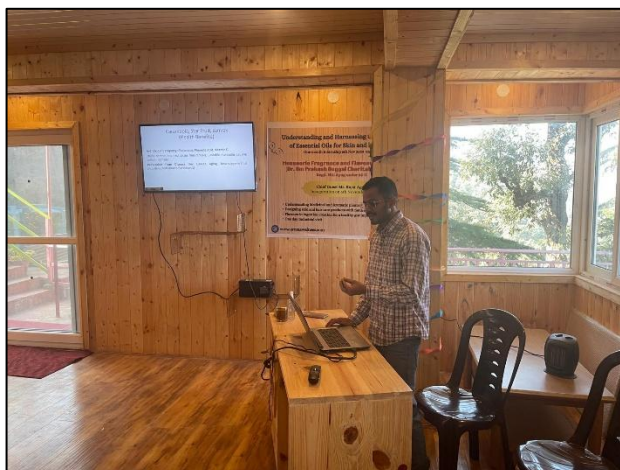

A scholarly article titled “Medicinal and Aromatic Plants for Natural Healing – The Deep-Time Evidence: Seeds in Soil, Stories in Stone” by Dr. Jyoti Marwah was published in *PALAEOSCIENCE TODAY*, Volume 1, Issue 2 (2025), a reputed publication of the Birbal Sahni Institute of Palaeosciences, Lucknow. Archaeobotanical and ethnobotanical studies reveal the deep history of fragrance in human culture. Excavations at Mohenjo-Daro uncovered faience vessels used for perfumes, incense, and powders, evidence that aromatics were integral to luxury, ritual, and social identity...Plant fossils, impressions, and carbonized seeds provide direct evidence of
